LOOKING FOR A NEW HOME FOR YOUR CAT?

Every year, people bring thousands of stray cats to our shelter. We often have more cats coming into our shelter than we have adoptive homes. Sadly, we sometimes are put in the awful position of euthanizing adoptable cats because we have no room to keep them.

If you are looking for a new home for your pet cat, we urge you to get on the waiting lists of one of the non-profit shelters. These shelters limit the number of cats they accept – and therefore don't have to euthanize animals to make room for others.

The non-profit shelters may have waiting lists for admission and sometimes close their waiting lists when the lists get too long. They usually have a suggested donation for taking an animal. The good news is that if your cat is admitted into one of these shelters, she will be cared for until a home can be found. The following are the largest private shelters in the Portland metro area. Please give these organizations a call if you need to place your cat.
