## LOOKING FOR A NEW HOME FOR YOUR DOG?

Our shelter takes care of stray dogs in Washington County. We usually do not have room to take in owner-surrendered dogs.

If you are looking for a new home for your dog, we urge you to talk with a non-profit shelter that may have room for your pet. These shelters limit the number of dogs they accept – and therefore don't have to euthanize animals to make room for others.

The non-profit shelters may have waiting lists for admission and do not accept every dog. They usually have a suggested donation for taking an animal. The good news is that if your dog is admitted into one of these shelters, she will be cared for until a home can be found. The following are the largest private shelters in the Portland metro area. Please give these organizations a call if you need to place your dog.

ALL OF THESE ORGANIZATIONS REQUIRE AN APPOINTMENT BEFORE THEY WILL ACCEPT A DOG. DO NOT PLAN TO JUST DROP OFF YOUR ANIMAL.
