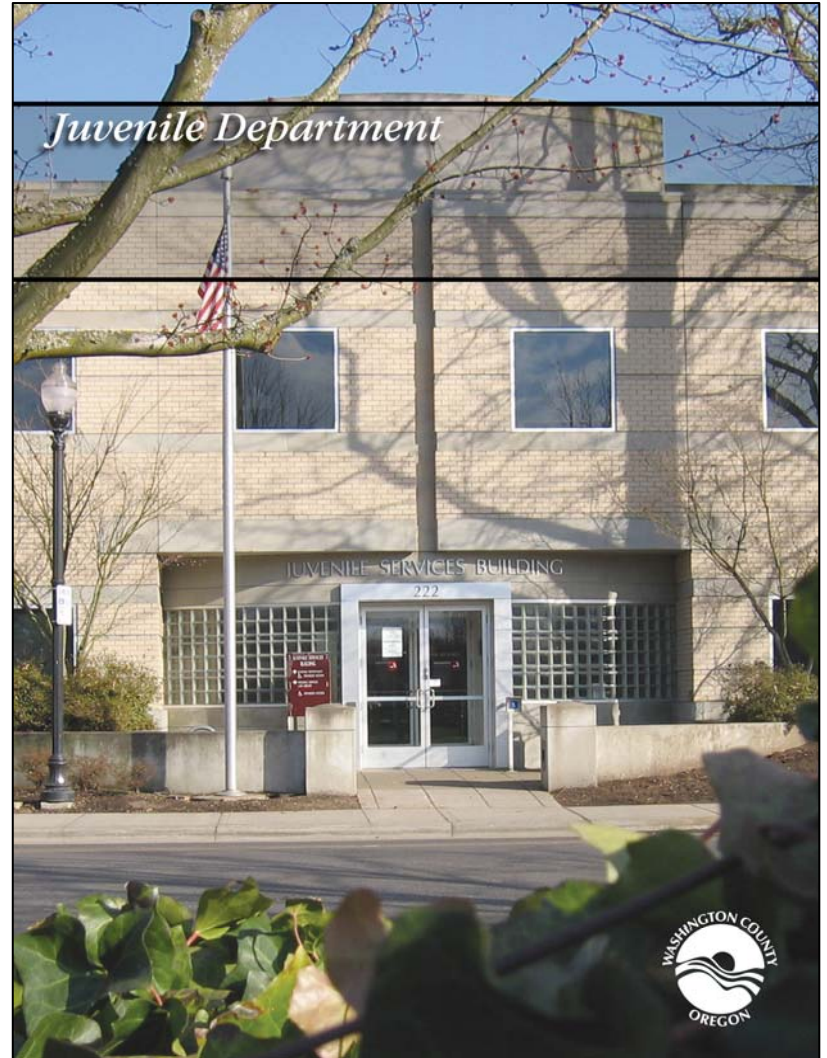

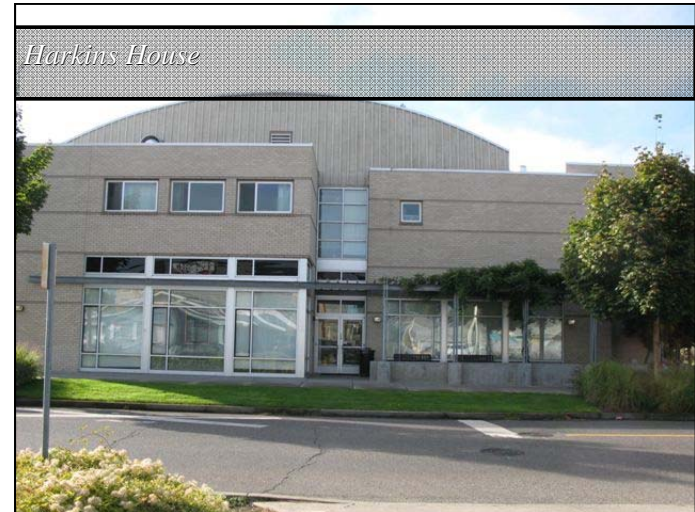

The Oregon Youth Authority

The Juvenile Department works in partnership with the Oregon Youth Authority, the state agency responsible for residential placement of youth, correctional facilities for youth, and supervision of those on parole. The Juvenile Court orders youths into the Oregon Youth Authority's custody for placement and services.

Juvenile Crime Prevention

School based intervention with high risk youth through contacts with community agency partners. The interventions used are research based effective services.

Admissions

Twenty-four hour staff available for law enforcement, crisis intervention, information, and transportation to Donald E. Long Detention Center located in Multnomah County. Admissions staff make the decisions regarding custody of a youth and direct law enforcement and the public to appropriate resources.

Assessment

Intake counselors assess lower level offenders and the needs and strengths of the youth and family to determine a course of action. Sanctions, such as restitution to victims and community service work, and/or referral to community resources can occur. The counselors may also determine that further services are warranted and a youth may be referred to the Early Intervention Unit or a legal document may be filed and the youth may go before the Court.

Early Intervention

Supervision and services for youth with multiple risk factors whose offense history does not require court intervention. Services include assessment, individual case plans, intensive supervision, and cognitive skills learning. Counselors coordinate services with families, schools, and community agencies to provide structured support to youths.

Court Services

Counselors in this unit and/or a deputy district attorney decide that a legal course of action may be warranted in a delinquent case.

Counselors gather background information, supervise youth awaiting court hearings, and prepare reports for the Court.

Recommendations are made to the court that will hold the youth accountable for behavior, address the needs of the victims and develop a plan or strategies that will aid the youth in reformation.

Pre-trial Supervision: Detention

Juvenile detention is provided at Multnomah County Donald E. Long Detention Center in Portland. The primary purpose of detention is temporary secure custody of youth awaiting a court hearings. Oregon statutory criteria guide the decision about lodging a youth in this secure setting.

Conciliation Services

Conciliation services assist parents in conflict over child custody and parenting time. Counselors offer both court-ordered and voluntary mediation services to help parents make decisions in ways that enhance the emotional well being of their children.

Counselors also conduct custody evaluations for the Family Court and provide counseling services to build family strengths.

Harkins House Shelter Evaluation Program

The Juvenile Department operates this structured residential evaluation and assessment shelter program for pre-adjudicated youths conditionally released from detention. Juvenile Counselors provide supervision, education, recreation, counseling and skills training. Written evaluations are prepared for the juvenile court's consideration prior to final disposition of a youth's case.

Home Detention Program

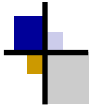
Juvenile Counselors provide daily monitoring, supervision and crisis intervention for youth and their families involved in this service. Youth involved are awaiting court hearings and are provided structured guidelines to follow in order to remain in their homes and community.

Probation: Field Unit, Diversion, Breaking the Cycle

Field Probation Counselors provide supervision and services for youth placed on probation by the Juvenile Court. Counselors develop individual case plans based on risk screen and court orders and provide supervision and services to achieve successful completion of probation.

Diversion provides intensive supervision and services to youth who are at a high risk of commitment to a Youth Correctional Facility. One Senior Juvenile Counselor provides added support to youth and families to promote protection of the community and to assist youth in remaining in the community.



Breaking the Cycle is a team approach program working with youth referred for sexual offenses and/or sexualized behaviors. The team of counselors is involved with the youth and family from point of referral through court hearings and probationary period. Intensive supervision and interventions are used to safely manage youth in the community and prevent re-offending.

Comprehensive Supervision Unit

This unit is a team approach providing assessments, intervention, pre-sentence investigation and probation supervision for youth affected by gang behaviors. The team provides avenues for pro social behavior and opportunities to develop skills youth may be lacking. Presentations on the history of gangs, local gangs, trends, and identification of gang behavior are also available.

Victim Services

A program that supports victims, with a focus on restitution and victims' rights. Victims are notified of court hearings and accompanied to hearings, given assistance in understanding the court process, and referred to other resources when needed.

Substance Abuse and Drug Court Program

Counselors provide an array of services including assessment, education, treatment groups, parent support and referrals to community resources for youth referred to the Juvenile Department on drug and alcohol offenses. The program also includes a drug court component including intensive services and immediate sanctions for youth.

Community Service

This program strives to build a sense of accountability in youth for the community and victims. The Juvenile Department provides opportunities to perform community service work on supervised work crews. Youth may earn credit that translates into direct payment of restitution for victims.
