Oregon State Legislature

- -2022 session ended on March 7th
- Added nearly \$2.7 billion in spending to the budget approved last year
- Priorities for new spending were housing, homelessness, mental health care, and childcare

Washington County Legislative Priorities

- Provide long-term COVID-19 response and recovery for our communities
- Restore funding to, and cost recovery for, County programs and services with a focus on the County Law Library and Juvenile Conciliation Services
- Secure long-term stability of revenues provided to the county by the state that offsets investments of local revenues
