Certificate Transfer

- Washington County Code Chapter 8.04.280: a certificate holder may transfer the certificate or a portion of the service area to other certificate holders after written notice and approval by the Board.
- Transfer Application submitted April 10, 2019
- Impacts 221 rural residential customers and 20 commercial customers
- Evergreen Disposal will begin service to those customers on July 1, 2019



Certificate Transfer Review

- Evergreen Disposal is purchasing inventory of equipment and assets from Cornelius Disposal & Recycling
- John Walker, Jeff Walker, Gary Douglas, and John P. Romero will be equal owners of Evergreen Disposal & Recycling
- Evergreen has sufficient equipment, facilities, and personnel to meet the county's service standards; provided a statement of all businesses used for the disposal of waste and recyclables; and submitted insurance information.




Rates
