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
### SHS program implementation

#### Service provider network expanded

Community-based organizations will provide supportive housing services:

- Emergency and bridge shelter programs
- Housing navigation, case management, and retention
- Supportive housing and transitional housing programs
- Peer supports, employment supports, disability benefits, and more
- Integrated services in partner systems: housing navigators

# Community Connect Modernized

A restructured Coordinated Entry system will help connect more people to services efficiently and effectively:

- More trained assessors
- Many doors for referral
- Phased and streamlined assessment

### Housing HCMS and Partners

Up to 40 new housing case managers to house 500 households experiencing prolonged homelessness

#### → New Rent Assistance Tools

Expanded rent assistance tools will help achieve Housing First programming:

New:

- Barrier buster and move-in funds

Leveraged:

### Bridge Shelters and Partners

Temporary non-congregate shelter will serve households referred to HCMS working toward supportive housing.

- Good Neighbor Center operating at Aloha Inn
- Greater Good Northwest operating at Econolodge
- Both programs supported by Urban League and Bienestar Housing Case Managers
- Referral through Community Connect for HCMS clients

Types of shelter programs to create a county shelter system that meets emergency sheltering needs

- Winter Shelter
- Year-round emergency shelter
- Inclement Weather
- Bridge Shelter Non-congregate
- Population Specific Shelter



Goal: 250 year-round beds | Year 1: 150 winter shelter beds



#### Year-round Emergency Shelter

- Permanent 24-hour shelter centers
- Opportunity to co-locate services, service hubs
- SHS program to fund operations, some capital improvements
- County to partner with cities and service providers
- Seeking 4-5 locations across the County

Next Steps:

- Search for viable year-round buildings suited for shelters
- Operators will be selected from qualified SHS supplier list, in partnership with city or building owner

These sites have been identified for potential shelter programs:

- PHC at Sonrise Church (winter 40 beds?)
- Just Compassion in Tigard (winter 20)
- Beaverton Community Center (winter 30)
- Salvation Army Hillsboro Thrift store (winter 40 beds?)
- Salvation Army's Oak Street in Hillsboro (inclement weather)

- 24-HOUR COOLING CENTER: CLOVERLEAF BUILDING COUNTY FAIRGROUNDS - PET FRIENDLY
- OVERNIGHT COOLING CENTER: BEAVERTON COMMUNITY CENTER - PET FRIENDLY
- Available till Saturday or Sunday dependent on location
