IV. COMMUNICATIONS AND PUBLIC COMMENT

No members of the public commented. Katherine Galian, CoC Program Manager of Washington County



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Department of Housing Services, was introduced to the committee.

V. NEW BUSINESS

A. Housing Legislative Agenda Forecast 2023

Erin Doyle, Washington County Senior Government Relations Manager, presented a County policy agenda and revenue forecast of Oregon and federal legislative session for 2023, in which the state and federal government adopt biennial budgets based on proposed needs. Her presentation is linked here. The committee members responded to the following presentation prompts:

- What legislative changes are critical to increasing housing stability in Washington County?
- How would you like to hear about the session as it progresses?

Rachael Duke commented that rent assistance is key to increasing housing stability. 10% of CPAH's past rent roll reflects their residents' struggle to keep up with rent payment. State legislature should continue to address barriers (rent and mental health) to housing stability. Carol Herron would like State Legislature to address steep rent increases in Oregon. Staff noted Carol's request. Robert Heard would like legislature to prioritize housing resources and ADA accommodations for the County's senior population due to a lack of affordable housing to meet the needs of our senior community members. It was agreed to have a regular legislative agenda update provided in HPAC meetings.

B. Homeless Services Annual Outcomes

Jes Larson, Supportive Housing Services Program Manager; Kisa Quanbeck, Community Connect Program Coordinator; and Jason Tate, Program Analyst, presented an annual outcomes update about SHS and Homeless Services program for 2021-2022. Their presentation is linked here. The committee responded to the following presentation prompts:

- What recommendations do members have about how we demonstrate outcomes?
- What outcome metrics matter most for the public and our community?

Stacey Triplett asked if the County would invest in access centers and conduct a competitive process to create them. Staff answered that the County will assess current drop-in centers and learn of their geographic needs to establish a strong network of access centers. Stacey inquired if the County's public-facing dashboard will measure SHS programmatic outcomes and success through year-by-year data comparison. Staff broadened the question to the committee and asked, What should we be accountable to outcomes? Robert asked how is the rehoused population tracked in County data? Staff shared two data points that the Department of Housing Services uses such as length of housing and returns to homelessness. Also, the County has unique data visibility established across service providers to avoid duplicate counting. Rachael suggested for the County to track positive exits from SHS programs.

Staff announced the "Housing Our Community: Celebrating A Year of Action" event on September 23, 2022 and invited the committee. The event will highlight stories of the impacts made by SHS programs.

VI. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

A. Housing Budget

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Komi Kalevor reported the following updates about the Department of Housing Services and Housing Authority of Washington County budgets:

- The County will roll out a multi-faceted public budget engagement process and implement a new Budget Equity Tool to build equity into decision-making of allocation of resources.
- Budget planning will begin, and engagement will be fully integrated into our prioritization of funding, staffing, and contracting. The community and various advisory boards will be engaged.
- B. HPAC Vacancy Update
 Rachael Duke introduced HPAC's latest Community Member At Large member, David Parker, of the YMCA of Columbia-Willamette.
- C. HPAC Retreat and Hybrid Meetings Staff announced the upcoming HPAC retreat event and transitioning virtual HPAC meetings to hybrid. Staff polled committee members for their preference of meeting in-person, online, or hybrid for November's HPAC meeting. Other members requested a third option to await information about the state of COVID-19 before deciding to meet in-person.

VII. STAFF REPORTS

- A. Continuum of Care (CoC) Programs
 Leslie Gong, DHS Program Analyst and Interim CoC Programs Manager, shared a status of the CoC program operation which is found on page 7 of the September Housing Advisory Committee (HAC) packet.
- B. Supportive Housing Services (SHS) Program

 Jes Larson, SHS Program Manager, provided a brief bimonthly update about SHS programs based on a report found on page 6 of the September Housing Advisory Committee (HAC) packet.

VIII. ANNOUNCEMENTS AND OPEN DISCUSSION

Robert Heard announced Just Compassion of East Washington County's "Golfathon" in October to support members of our community facing homelessness.
