## CONTINUUM OF CARE (CoC) BOARD POSITIONS

(Refer to CoC Governance policy 578.5-OR506CoC)

- Role: The CoC Board is comprised of public and private representatives of the homeless subpopulations that exist within the CoC geographic region, a formerly homeless consumer representative, and the Emergency Solutions Grant recipient agency. The CoC Board operates in compliance with Federal CoC Program compliance requirements outlined in 24 CFR Part 578.5(b) and the local HSSN CoC Governance Policy.
- Perform CoC strategic planning, coordinate with and/or assist in State and local discharge Responsibilities: planning, review performance outcomes of HMIS and HUD-funded programs, develop housing and service systems alignment, seek out and prioritize public funds to address needs and gaps in the homeless system, review and approve local A Road Home Annual Homeless Assessment Report and Federal reports (e.g. APR, LSA, SPM, PIT, HIC), and the Federal McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance grant application.

Board Membership: 19 voting positions with 4-year term. No more than one representative from each agency as a voting position. Facilitators are non-voting positions but can vote to break a tie vote. All members are required to attend a minimum of 83% (5 of 6) meetings annually, with removal from the Board if less than 83% of meetings attended July to June period.
