What is the LSA?

- *A HUD data collection and analysis tool that allows us to view our homeless response system as a whole and measure impact of our coordinated effort to make homelessness rare, brief, and non-recurring.*
- *The annual data collection process that HUD uses to compile the Annual Homeless Assessment Report (AHAR) to Congress. The AHAR is a report to the U.S. Congress on the extent and nature of homelessness in the United States. It provides counts of people experiencing homelessness and describes their demographic characteristics and service use patterns. It is used by Congress to measure the impact of federal investments and determine future appropriations.*



What in is the LSA?

The LSA includes the following data for participants served in all projects in our continuum during the Federal Fiscal year:

- *Demographic characteristics like age, race, gender, and veteran status;*
- *Length of time homeless and patterns of system use;*
- *Information specific to populations whose needs and/or eligibility for services may differ from the broader homeless population, such as veterans and people and households experiencing chronic homelessness; and*
- *Housing outcomes for those who exit the homeless services system.*



What is in the LSA?

The LSA also includes data about past cohorts:

The exit cohort time periods include:

- 1. The cohort that exited during the two years prior to the current LSA report period;*
- 2. The cohort that exited during the one year prior to the current LSA report period; and*
- 3. The cohort that exited in the first six months of the current LSA report period.*



What is in the LSA?

Inflow: Who is accessing our shelter, transitional housing, rapid rehousing and permanent supportive housing programs?

Outflow: How long is it taking people to get housed after they enroll in a program?

Flow through: How long are people staying engaged in our programs before and after they are housed?

Not in the LSA:

- Street outreach data
- Coordinated entry data
 - CompSite data
- Other Permanent Housing Programs (non PSH)



What is it telling us?


Households with Days Homeless Trend

For each reporting year, households that had at least one day in ES, SH, TH, or RRH; or at least one day in PSH prior to move-in.



Days Homeless Trend by Household Type

For each reporting year, the average cumulative, unduplicated number of days that households were served in ES, SH, or TH projects; and days in RRH or PSH prior to move-in.







What is it telling us?

Exits to Permanent Destinations Trend

Number of households that exited from the homeless system and percent that exited to permanent destinations within each of the past three years.









What is it telling us?

Percent of households that exited to permanent, temporary, and unknown destinations by household type.






What is it telling us?

Percent and number of households in each population group, and percent and number of households in each population group that exited to permanent, temporary and unknown destinations.






What is it telling us?

Percent of households that returned to the homeless system within six months of exiting to a permanent destination within each of the past three years. For the current report period, the universe for the chart is households that exited within the first six months of the report period.

Demographics Comparison



Households Served by Project Type




Prior Living Situation for Households






Gender of HoH and Adults



Race and Ethnicity of HoH and Adults




Chronic Homelessness and Disabling Condition of HoH and Adults



Days Homeless by Pathway


Percent and number of households that used each pathway and average cumulative days that households in each pathway group were homeless.


Days Homeless by Population Group

System Performance Map

Households use different combinations of project types during the time they are served in the homeless system. These project type combinations are referred to as pathways. Each pathway has different average cumulative days homeless, exits to permanent housing and returns to the homeless system. The system map shows performance for the main project types in the homeless system and can be filtered to show performance for the main pathways.
