ADDITIONAL BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

Public Health 101 Series

PHAC members have previously provided feedback that it would be helpful to better understand the role and function of governmental public health to feel better prepared to provide input on topics brought to this group. To help members better understand the role of governmental public health, we will be regularly utilizing our monthly meetings to introduce public health and learn about the sciences essential to public health.

This month, we will be using the <u>CDC's Public Health 101</u> series. We will be reviewing the <u>Introduction to Public Health</u> webinar which will review:

- Key public health terms
- Historical developments from four public health perspectives
- Determinants of health and their effects on population health

Modernization Process Metrics

As we discussed last month, we are hoping to shift the process for how we bring information related to modernization to this group. Rather than formal, fully packaged presentations, we're hoping to use a series of conversations and present information in a more "bite sized" format.

This month we will continue our conversation around modernization process metrics focusing on understanding what the current state is related to each of the three priority areas:

- Reduce the spread of syphilis and prevent congenital syphilis
- Protect people from preventable diseases by increasing vaccination rates
- Increase community resilience for climate impacts on health: extreme heat and wildfire smoke

As well as provide an update on our process for selecting process metrics for this biennium.
