In January, PHAB members identified a need to develop a vision for the public health system to inform future priorities and funding.


Proposed approach

### PHAB Grounding


 The Public Health Advisory Board (PHAB) is established by ORS 431.122 for the purpose of advising and making recommendations to the Oregon Health Authority (OHA) and the Oregon Health Policy Board (OHPB).

### Membership highlights

- Fourteen members appointed by the Governor including but not limited to the following
- A local public health administrator who supervises public health programs and public health activities
  - Benton, Clackamas, Deschutes, Jackson, Lane, Marion, Multnomah or Washington County;
  - Coos, Douglas, Josephine, Klamath, Linn, Polk, Umatilla or Yamhill County;
  - Clatsop, Columbia, Crook, Curry, Hood River, Jefferson, Lincoln, Tillamook, Union or Wasco County;
  - Baker, Gilliam, Grant, Harney, Lake, Malheur, Morrow, Sherman, Wallowa or Wheeler County;
- A local health officer who is not a local public health administrator;
- An individual who represents the Conference of Local Health Officials created under ORS 431.330

### CLHO & PHAO Grounding

- "The <u>Conference of Local Health Officials</u> exists in Oregon Revised Statutes (<u>ORS 431.330</u>) to provide recommendations on foundational capabilities and modernization to the Oregon Health Authority."
- "The Conference of Local Health Officials has <u>three caucuses</u> that each have a seat on the Conference Board of Directors. The caucuses serve to represent the diverse public health workforce in Oregon."
- The Conference of Local Health Officials <a href="By-Laws">By-Laws</a> last revision was 10-15-15 and may not fully align with current statutes (ORS 431.413, OAR 333-014-0550, ORS 431.415, ORS 431.447, ORS 431.418, ORS 431.131, ORS 431.141)

### **Opportunity**

 Engage with the OHPB Health Equity Committee (HEC) to collaborate and recommend changes to OHPB

#### Definition of health equity

Oregon will have established a health system that creates health equity when all people can reach their full health potential and well-being and are not disadvantaged by their race, ethnicity, language, disability, gender, gender identity, sexual orientation, social class, intersections among these communities or identities, or other socially determined circumstances.

Achieving health equity requires the ongoing collaboration of all regions and sectors of the state, including tribal governments to address:

- · The equitable distribution or redistribution of resources and power; and
- Recognizing, reconciling and rectifying historical and contemporary injustices.
