Sheriff's Deputies Search for Subway Robbery Suspects

September 30, 2015—Washington County Sheriff's Deputies are searching for two men after they robbed a Subway Restaurant.

On September 30, 2015, at 5:07 a.m., Sheriff's Deputies were called to the 24-hour Subway sandwich restaurant at 10725 SW Beaverton Hillsdale Highway in the community of Raleigh Hills, concerning a robbery. Upon arrival, deputies learned there were two men who robbed the 22 year-old male clerk. Sheriff's Deputies, assisted by Beaverton Police Officers responded to the area to search for the suspects.

Sheriff's Deputies were told the robbery suspects came into the restaurant a minute prior to the clerk calling the Sheriff's Office and came to the back area. The clerk told Sheriff's Deputies that one of the men displayed an unspecified weapon and demanded the cash in the register. The employee gave the men a very small amount of cash and they fled on foot. The employee was not injured.

Sheriff's Deputies searched the area with the assistance of a Beaverton Police Department K9 and handler with no success. There was possibly a vehicle that was used to flee the area. Investigators are inspecting surveillance video and other evidence. The video is not releasable at this time.

The Washington County Violent Crime Unit Detectives were contacted and are continuing the investigation. The Washington County Forensic Science Unit assisted with the crime scene processing. It was reported that the Portland Police Bureau was investigating a similar robbery that occurred in SE Portland about an hour prior. Both robberies had numerous similarities; however it has not been confirmed they were committed by the same people.

Both men were described as dark skinned black males, 16-22 years old with thin builds. One was reported to be of medium height and the other was shorter. They both were reportedly wearing dark clothing and had cloths covering their faces.
