## Man Crashes Stolen Car into a Home and Then Barricades in Another November 21, 2019

On Thursday, November 21, 2019, at 10:25 a.m., Washington County Sheriff's Office deputies were dispatched to hit and run crash near the area of SW 198<sup>th</sup> Ave. and SW Kinnaman Road. Deputies found out a blue Toyota 4Runner, stolen out of Forest Grove earlier in the morning, had left the scene. Deputies responded to the area and saw the Toyota heading east on SW Farmington Road.

Deputies tried to stop the Toyota, but the vehicle was able to elude them near SW 170<sup>th</sup> Ave. and SW Farmington Road. Shortly after, dispatch received a call of a suspicious male, later



identified as Isaiah Mohr, cleaning a blue Toyota 4Runner near the 16000 block of SW Timberland Drive.

Two deputies arrived, located Mr. Mohr with the vehicle, and confirmed it was the stolen Toyota 4Runner. The Toyota and a patrol car collided as the suspect attempted to flee, causing one deputy to sustain injuries. The deputy was transported to a local hospital by Metro West Ambulance and has since been released. Immediately after colliding with the first deputy, the suspect hit another patrol car and caused minor damage.

The Toyota left the scene of both crashes and was seen shortly after traveling northbound on SW 170<sup>th</sup> Ave. The suspect attempted to turn west on SW Sugar Plum Lane but failed to navigate the turn causing him to crash through a home. Mr. Mohr ran from the vehicle and into a nearby house on SW 171<sup>st</sup> Ave., which was occupied by an adult female who was eventually able to get out safely. Deputies surrounded the house and could see Mr. Mohr inside. At one point, deputies saw Mr. Mohr make a sandwich for himself in the kitchen.

Member of the inter-agency Washington County <u>Tactical Negotiation Team</u> (TNT), <u>Robot Team</u>, and, <u>Crisis Negotiation Unit</u> (CNU) responded to the scene. Mr. Mohr refused to come out of the home or communicate with negotiators. TNT members entered the house and took Mr. Mohr into custody.

Mr. Mohr was treated at a local hospital due to exposure from pepper spray and being involved in several crashes.

Mr. Mohr was lodged in the Washington County Jail on the following charges:

- · Burglary in the first degree
- Fleeing or attempting to elude police officer (felony)
- Unauthorized use of a vehicle
- Unlawful entry into a motor vehicle
- Failure to perform duties of a driver (property is damaged)
- Failure to perform duties of a driver (injured person)
- Criminal driving while suspended or revoked (misdemeanor)
- · Criminal mischief in the first degree, two counts
- Theft in the third degree

During the incident, roads in the area were shut down for nearly three hours, and area Beaverton School District schools were put in Lockout. Once the scene was secured the Lockouts were lifted, and the roads were reopened.
