- Use statewide data to inform how businesses and schools can safely reopen.

  - 9 From Safe Sleep RV



# School-Aged Learning Support

## Child Care Grant (MESO)

- 243 Applications have been completed to date
- 272 awards (some applicants have multiple sites)
- Approximately \$2.72 million has been awarded

## School District Early Learning Support Program

- All School Districts participating
- Hybrid model of onsite programs and reimbursing families

# Phase 2 Reopening Discussion

## Metro counties are recommending a phase 1.B

- Goals include:
  - Minimize Covid-19 hospitalizations and death
  - Balance the risk of Covid-19 transmission with other health drivers like employment, business viability, learning opportunities, behavioral health risk and social isolation
- Components of our recommended plan:
  - Changes to the metrics and reopening metric
  - Consider K-5<sup>th</sup> grade in-person learning with public health precautions to protect students, staff and faculty
  - Adapt sector/business guidance to allow businesses that can follow precautions to reopen

Social/Private Clubs-No license (OPEN - 50 or less on-site, follow Gatherings Guidance)

Indoor Theaters (OPEN-50 or less on-site, follow restaurant and bars guidance)

Full Contact Sports (STAY CLOSED)
