6 This matter having come before the Washington County Board on April 21, 2020, and

7 It appearing to the Board that:

8 WHEREAS, ORS 401.305 provides authority for Washington County to act as an emergency  
9 management agency, including authority to establish policies and protocols for defining and  
10 directing responsibilities during time of emergency; and

11 WHEREAS, on March 4, 2020 the Board of Commissioners adopted a Resolution and Order  
12 declaring a state of emergency and the conditions that created that state of emergency continue  
13 to exist; and

14 WHEREAS, Washington County has enacted a local ordinance (County Code Chapter  
15 8.36) pursuant to the authority granted by ORS Chapter 401 and the Washington County  
16 Charter, that provides for executive responsibility in times of emergency and specifically  
17 delegates authority to declare a state of emergency to the Board of Commissioners, or if a  
18 quorum of the Board of Commissioners is unavailable, to the County Chair, Vice Chair,  
19 Commissioners, County Administrator, Assistant Administrator, Sheriff (if preceding official is  
20 unavailable); and

21 WHEREAS, the following conditions have resulted in the need for an extension of the  
22 declaration of the state of emergency:

1 The number of COVID-19 cases continue to escalate in Washington County; and

2 WHEREAS, the following disruption of important services, damage to life, or damage to  
3 property can be expected from the above conditions:

4 COVID-19 continues to expand in Washington County and worldwide. County resources  
5 continue to be needed to respond to this threat to keep the public as safe as possible. Resources  
6 related to disease investigation and prevention, public information, continuity of operations,  
7 assistance to homeless individuals, support for families affected by the illness, personal  
8 protective equipment, and funding are expected to be exhausted; and

9 WHEREAS, the foregoing continues to affect the entire County and;  
10 now, therefore, it is

11 RESOLVED AND ORDERED that the Board of Commissioners for Washington County  
12 formally extends the declaration of a state of emergency for Washington County that the Board  
13 adopted and was in effect on March 4, 2020, extended on March 17, 2020, extended again on  
14 March 31, 2020, and extend again on April 7, 2020; and it is further

15 RESOLVED AND ORDERED that, upon declaration of a state of emergency the Board of  
16 Commissioners shall be authorized to take such actions and issue such orders as are determined  
17 to be necessary to protect the public and property and to efficiently conduct activities that  
18 minimize or mitigate the effect of the emergency as described in WCC 8.36.050., and further that  
19 the County Office of Emergency Management is empowered to carry out the appropriate  
20 function and duties identified in County Code Chapter 8.36 during times of emergency and shall  
21 implement the Washington County Emergency Operations Plan; and it is further

1 RESOLVED AND ORDERED that the Emergency Program Manager shall take all necessary  
2 steps authorized by law to coordinate response and recovery from this emergency including, but  
3 not limited to, requesting assistance and potential reimbursements from the State of Oregon and  
4 the appropriate federal agencies; and it is further

5 RESOLVED AND ORDERED that emergency procurements of goods and services are  
6 authorized pursuant to ORS 279B.080, ORS 279C.335(6), ORS 279.380(4), and Rules of  
7 Procurement, Section 20-020; and it is further

8 RESOLVED AND ORDERED that the County Administrative Officer is delegated authority to  
9 authorize contracts under this emergency declaration in amounts of up to five hundred thousand  
10 dollars (\$500,000) and will follow the emergency procedures in the Rules of Procurement, Section  
11 20-020; and it is further

12 RESOLVED AND ORDERED that this declaration of emergency shall expire on May 5, 2020.
