



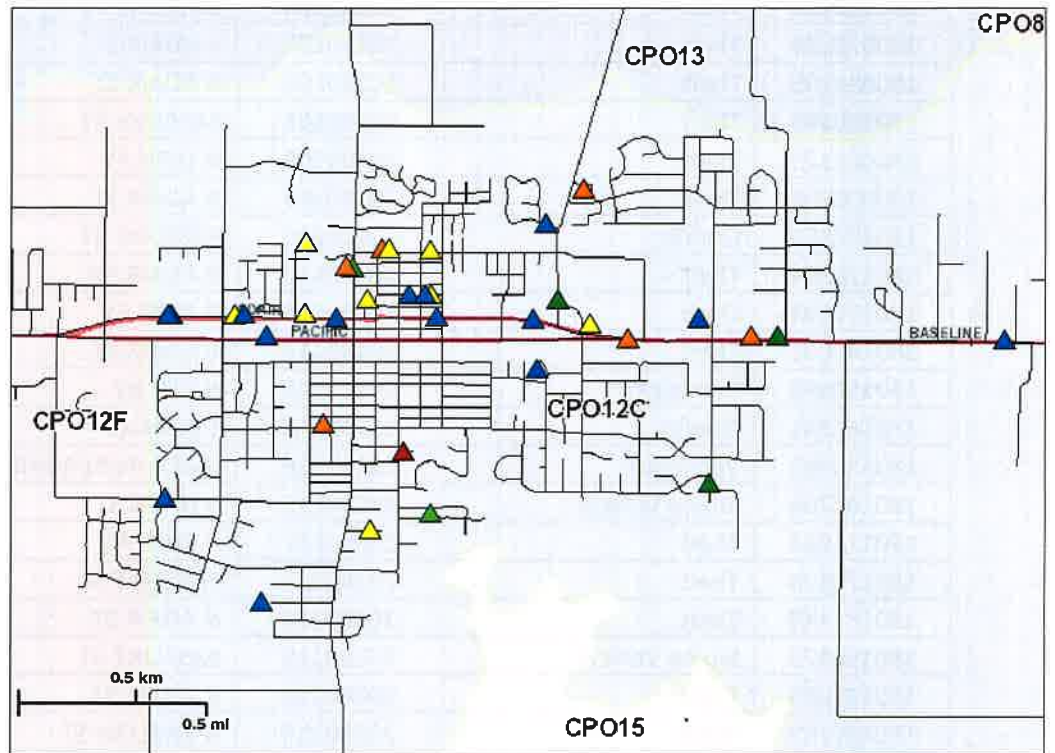

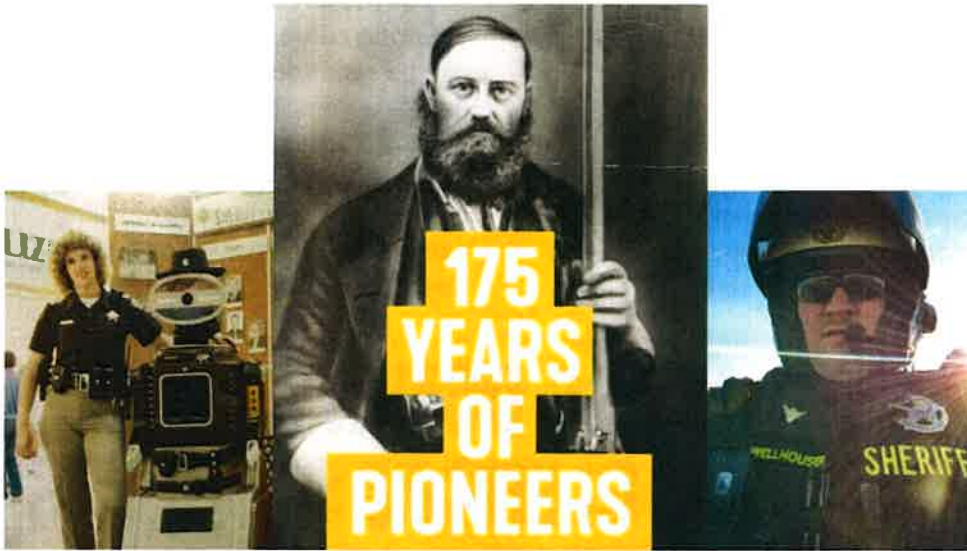

## WCSEO INVESTIGATING JANUARY SHOOTING NEAR SHERWOOD

On Friday, January 12, dispatch received a report of a suspicious vehicle driving in a field on a property near the intersection of Southwest Roy Rogers Road and Southwest Scholls-Sherwood Road outside of Sherwood. Initial reports to dispatch were that Remi Sabbe of Tigard, 54, was acting erratically. Witnesses reported hearing shots fired in the area prior to law enforcement arrival. Officers closed the heavily-traveled Southwest Roy Rogers Road and other surrounding arterial streets.

At approximately 3:30 p.m., members of the inter-agency Tactical Negotiations Team (TNT) attempted to contact Mr. Sabbe in his vehicle. Mr. Sabbe drove away from tactical officers and a Pursuit Intervention Technique maneuver was conducted on his vehicle. At one point, Mr. Sabbe started to exit his vehicle with an AR-15 rifle still in his lap. From inside the truck's cab, Mr. Sabbe turned towards tactical officers and pointed the rifle at them. Tactical officers then fired upon Mr. Sabbe.

TNT members, including embedded tactical combat medics, attempted lifesaving measures but Mr. Sabbe was pronounced deceased at the scene. A loaded AR-15 rifle was recovered from inside the truck.

The Washington County Sheriff's Office is proud to celebrate 175 years of honorary service to our great community. Today, Sheriff Pat Garrett serves as the 32nd Sheriff of Washington County.

### NEW PARKING ORDINANCE CHANGES IN THE ESPD

Several changes have been made to the ESPD Towing and Parking Ordinance. RVs, boats and trailers cannot be parked on a residential street in the ESPD for a period in excess of four days (96 consecutive hours) in any 28-day period. Commercial vehicles, such as semi-trucks, cannot be parked on residential streets, as well. Learn more on our website.

## 16 ARRESTED AFTER MISSION ON FIVE PROPERTIES

December 29 - WCSO and the Hillsboro Police Department began a proactive mission concerning possible criminal activity on five properties in Hillsboro and Aloha, leading to 16 arrests in less than one week. Crimes included possession of a modified rifle, possession of methamphetamine, possession of heroin, driving while criminally suspended, carrying a concealed weapon and numerous arrest warrants.

## CRASH LEAVES 11 ELK DEAD; DRIVER UNINJURED

January 4 - A 2004 Chevrolet Avalanche was traveling eastbound on Sunset Highway near NW Dersham Road west of North Plains when it crashed into several elk crossing the highway. The driver did not suffer any injuries, though 11 elk were killed as a result of the crash. Oregon State Police Fish and Wildlife Troopers responded to the crash and later salvaged the elk meat for distribution at local senior centers and food banks.
