Proposed Cleaner Air Rules Provide Comments through December 22

Oregon Department of Environmental Quality and Oregon Health Authority are opening a public comment period on proposed new rules that regulate industrial air toxins. The proposed rules would set health risk limits on pollutants and would close gaps in the State's existing air quality rules. There will be six public hearings about the draft rules.
