The Cooper Mountain Transportation Study

The Cooper Mountain area is experiencing increased traffic demand from regional growth and nearby developing areas. Building on recommendations from the Washington County Transportation Futures Study, the Cooper Mountain Transportation Study will evaluate roadway network options to disperse traffic through the area. This will include assessment of transportation improvements to determine the benefits, costs, opportunities and constraints of the alternatives. The assessment will inform decisions about the long-term multimodal transportation network within the study area and will help prioritize future capital projects.

Willamette Water Supply Program Community Open House - June 5, 4:30-6:30 pm

At the Cooper Mountain Nature House, 18892 SW Kemmer Road

In the planning are two water storage tanks to be designed and built on Cooper Mountain to provide an earthquake resilient water system for the region. In addition, the storage tanks will supply extra water needed during peak water-use days and will provide locally-stored water for emergencies such as fighting fires, even during power outages. **Come learn about the program and the planned drinking water tanks and pipeline projects!** Program staff will be available to answer questions and get feedback. Water tank and nearby pipeline construction is currently scheduled to begin in 2022.
