Just Released: Safe Routes to School Access Improvement Study

A study of the roadways surrounding 53 Washington County public schools has identified safety concerns on routes that students use to walk, bike or roll to school. Part of the County's Safe Routes to School Program, the study provides the first comprehensive look at the extent of traffic infrastructure barriers that prevent or limit students' ability to walk to school safely.

Park and Field Coming by Mountain View Middle School

Tualatin Hills Park & Recreation District's 2016 Bond projects include the development of a 21.5-acre community park at and around Mountain View Middle School. Project includes the creation of "Champions Too," Oregon's first multipurpose athletic field designed for people of all abilities. Project also includes side-by-side synthetic turf fields, a baseball field with a multipurpose outfield, tennis and basketball courts, a community garden and an inclusive play area. Construction is to begin this summer with completion set for fall 2017.
