

CATT Steering Committee Charter

Purpose of Committee: To provide strategic guidance on the development of the Center for Addictions Triage and Treatment (CATT), a proposed comprehensive substance use treatment center in Washington County. To ensure collaboration across system partners to conceive and develop a program that is responsive to community need and integrated into the existing system of care. To provide broad direction to other project work groups and the leadership team.

Areas of Focus: This committee is primarily responsible for guidance that helps steer the activity of various work groups formed for this project. Key tasks will include:

1. Guidance on program development.
2. Identification of potential opportunities and barriers to program success, and direction and support to project leadership addressing these issues.
3. Review and provide input on key milestone documents, including the Feasibility Study.
4. Resource allocation for their agency's participation in related work groups.
5. Communication and advocacy back to affiliated organization/agency/work group.
