### Monthly Safety Self-Inspection

**Spa & Enclosure**

- Fences – Openings < 4”, Good Repair
- Doors & Gates – Self-Closes, Completely Latches, Good Condition
- Window / Sliding Glass Door – Open < 4”
- Deck Equipment – Good Condition, Fasteners and Fittings not corroded  
Stairs – Handrail tight
- Depth Marking – Easily Readable
- Deck – Clean, Disinfected, Good Repair, No Puddles, No Carpet/Matting/Wood
- Spa Basin – In Good Repair
- Skimmers / Gutters / Tile Line – Clean, Good Repair
- Lighting – Maintained, Adequate
- Safety Equipment – Provided, Good Repair  
First Aid Kit Stocked, Phone Working
- Test Kit – Clean, Stocked w/ Fresh Reagents, Stored in Cool, Dry Location
- Spa Temperature - <104°F. (Ideal 102°F. or less)
- Water Changed – at least monthly, best changed when (“# of bathers” = Volume (gal.) / 3)

**Recirculation Equipment**

- Pumps / Filter / Disinfectant Feeders  
Maintained, Good Repair
- Gauges – Working, Accurate  
Readings within Parameters
- Piping – Good Repair, Marked, No Leaks
