Welcome

Martin Granum called the meeting to order. Introductions were made of all committee members and County staff. The May minutes were reviewed. Anthony Mills motioned to approve the minutes, Ruth Deal seconded the motion. All were in favor.

Martin commended Bonnie Hadley as URMD Budget Committee Chair and thanked Victoria Saager and Dave Schamp for their presentation to the committee.

Safety improvement Projects

Zach Morris gave an update on the progress of the three remaining projects for FY 2013-14.

- Leahy Road – Bids opened June 13 and go to the Board next week. Expect to start construction late July and to be done before start of school late this summer.
- McDaniel Road will go out for bid soon, construction this fall.
- Laidlaw Road – Board of Commissioners authorized right-of-way to proceed with acquisition, still hoping to construct this year.

Philip McCormick gave an update on two bid packets coming up for FY 2014-15. First bid packet – 209th Avenue, Kinnaman Road, and 178th (including URMD contribution of \$300K) – plans are at 100%, out to bid July 21 and into construction September to November. Second bid packet –

McDaniel Road, Cornell Road, Evergreen Road, and 119th Avenue at Lovejoy – go out for bid July 15, construction to start September or October.

Safe Routes to School

Shelly Oylear gave a [presentation about the Safe Routes to School](#) (SRTS) program. Benefits of the safe routes to school include health, environment, safety, community livability, and economics.

Funds for the county's program fund one part-time SRTS coordinator for the county. Thirteen cities, seven school districts, 50 elementary public schools, 20 junior/middle and 24 high schools are involved. There is no funding for construction of capital projects. Shelley is looking for opportunities to fund. State funds are easier; when federal funds are used it takes double the time and cost.

Oregon SRTS awarded \$150K from their program in 2014. It is used to reimburse for Joy Chang for three years. Joy is the coordinator; the balance of her time is used with trails. Tigard-Tualatin School District will be getting a representative for walk/bike to school outreach.

Inventory of sidewalks for schools on county roads will be done one mile around each school.

Miscellaneous

Victoria noted the public was asked for small safety improvement nominations to be submitted by July 15. There is no Minor Betterment funding planned for FY 2016-17. The URMD Safety Improvement program will be the only funding available for these projects next year.
