

OVERVIEW: URMD SAFETY IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS

The <u>Urban Road Maintenance District</u> (URMD) funds small-scale safety improvement projects, which include sidewalks, pathways, bike lanes and paved shoulders. Since 2011, 41 URMD Safety Improvement Projects totaling over \$14 million have been funded. Over 150 candidates are currently available for consideration. Eligible proposals submitted through July 15 will be considered for FY 2018-2019 funding.

The fundamental criteria:

- 1. **Safety:** They are intended to improve a specific safety situation.
- 2. **Location**: They must be located within URMD.
- 3. **Small scale:** Typical projects cost less than \$500,000, though larger projects may be considered.

URMD project selection process:

The public submits proposals

Eligible candidates reviewed by URMDAC URMDAC selects top candidates for consideration

Community invited to comment on candidates

URMDAC selects projects for following fiscal year

Propose a candidate for URMD funding:

To propose a candidate, submit an online form at bit.ly/SRIrequest. Eligible candidates must address a safety or connectivity issue on an URMD-eligible County road.
