



# Transportation Safety Action Plan

## **What is a TSAP?**

The Transportation Safety Action Plan (TSAP) reviews transportation-related serious injury and fatality crash data on County roads to determine crash trends (types of crashes, functional road class, road-user type, etc). After analyzing this data, action items are developed in order to reduce (with the goal of eliminating) these types of crashes on County roadways.

## **Using the 5 E's**

The plan will employ the Federal Highway Administrations "5 E's" – Engineering, Enforcement, Education, Encouragement, and Evaluation. More emphasis on one or more of these elements will be based on the results of the crash data trends.

## **What is the timeline for the TSAP?**

Washington County received a grant from the Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) fall 2015. Staff has started to gather crash data from multiple sources, and plans to hold the first bimonthly TSAP Advisory Committee meeting in March. In-person and on-line open houses will be held in summer. The TSAP is required to be finalized by September 2016. It will then be taken to the Board of Commissioners for adoption.

## **After it is adopted, then what?**

The TSAP will help with project prioritization and leveraging of funds for needed programs or projects that will address the plan's goals. Depending on the crash trend results, action items may include enhancing alcohol and drug programs to making engineering-related changes. Specifics will be determined once data is gathered and analyzed.
