16 People Arrested During Proactive Mission on Five Properties

January 4, 2018 – The Sheriff's Office partnered with the Hillsboro Police Department on a mission to target five properties in Aloha and Hillsboro, leading to 16 arrests in less than a week.

Over the past months, the two agencies have taken many reports concerning possible criminal activity at the five properties. The mission included the SW Ping Court address which was part of a recent mission, search warrant, and media release. The other addresses were in the 19500 block of SW Blaine Street, the 2900 block of SW Cornelius Pass Road, the 3800 block of SW Morganfield Terrace, and the 21500 block of SW Nicholas Court.

On Friday, December 29, 2017, the Sheriff's Office and the Hillsboro Police Department began a proactive enhanced patrol mission on all five locations. During the overnight mission, 14 people were arrested, including a juvenile who was found in possession of a modified rifle. Other crimes included possession of methamphetamine, possession of heroin, driving while criminally suspended, carrying a concealed weapon, and numerous arrest warrants.

This morning, deputies served a related search warrant at the SW Blaine Street house. Of the five people at the home this morning, deputies arrested one for delivery and possession of methamphetamine and one for a warrant. Investigators also seized a stolen car, stolen property, and drugs.

The Sheriff's Office and Hillsboro Police Department had help from the Westside Inter-Agency Narcotics and Inter-Agency Gang Enforcement teams, as well as two K-9 teams. They were also assisted by Sheriff's Office detectives from the Violent Crimes Unit and Special Investigations Unit.
