Man Injured After Early Morning Shooting in Aloha

September 6, 2018

On Thursday, September 6, 2018, at 6:30 a.m., Washington County Sheriff's Office deputies responded to an assault near 18000 SW Shaw S. in the community of Aloha. Multiple residents called 911 after hearing an altercation and gun shots.

When deputies arrived, they discovered a person in the street who had been shot. Additional deputies converged on the area and began searching for the suspect with the help of a K9. As a precaution, Aloha High School and the International School of Beaverton were briefly put on lockdown during the search.

Deputies were unable to locate the suspect, but remained on scene for several hours, canvassing the area for witnesses. Investigators are still trying to determine the relationship between the victim and the suspect. At this time, there is no reason to believe there is any danger to the public.

The victim, a 37-year-old male, was transported by Metro West Ambulance to an area hospital. The extent of his injuries and his current condition are unknown.



The suspect is described as an adult male, possibly in his early 20s, with shoulder length curly hair. It is believed that the suspect was wearing a white shirt and dark pants.
