Deputies Arrest Six for DUII in Two Hours

March 22, 2014 – Washington County Deputies initiated several Driving Under the Influence of Intoxicants (DUII) investigations Friday night into Saturday morning. During a two hour timeframe, deputies arrested six people for DUII.

Early Saturday morning, from 1:20 a.m. to 3:10 a.m., Deputies performed several traffic stops and responded to two crashes. Their efforts resulted in six arrests for DUII. Deputies are aware this is the first weekend of Spring Break and are especially vigilant with efforts to keep Washington County roads safe.

The Washington County Sheriff's Office has a long history of commitment to DUII enforcement and receives grant funds to increase directed patrols to reduce the number of intoxicated drivers on the road. Enhanced DUII enforcement efforts can significantly reduce alcohol related fatalities as much as 34% reports one study by The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.

The Washington County Sheriff's Office advises citizens to not drive after consumption of alcohol or drugs. If travel is necessary, the Sheriff's Office encourages citizens to arrange alternate transportation.
