Car Jacking leads to Multi-Agency Pursuit and Capture of Suspect

Sunday, December 14, 2014 -- A car jacking suspect was taken into custody today after he stole a car and injured the owner as he drove away. Police were able to locate the car and the suspect led them on a pursuit that ended with the suspect crashing.

On Sunday, December 14, 2014, at about 10:00 a.m., Sheriff's Deputies serving the City of Cornelius responded to a reported stolen car at 366 N. 1st. Place, Cornelius. The 46-year-old victim reported that he had left his car running in front of his house this morning. He said he saw a man get in his car and he ran out to confront him.

The victim said he yelled at the suspect (58-year-old Raymond Osborne of Portland) and opened the door of the car. He said Mr. Osborne shoved the door into him and then sped off, knocking him to the ground. The victim sustained minor injuries.

Deputies broadcast a "Be On the Look Out" (BOLO) which alerts all the police in the area of the stolen car. A Trooper with the Oregon State Police spotted the car in the City of Banks and attempted to stop it. Mr. Osborne lead the trooper on a pursuit that eventually concluded with him crashing on Highway 26 and Lower Nehalem Road in Tillamook County. Two Washington

County Sheriff's deputies were close behind and assisted in taking Mr. Osborne into custody.

Mr. Osborne was booked into the Washington County Jail on charges of Robbery I, Assault II, Unauthorized Use of a Vehicle, and Theft I. His bail is set at \$250,000.
