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Auditor's Review of Information Security Follow-Up Assessment March 2024

The Washington County Auditor's Office published this audit in November 2022.

Purpose: We conducted this review to determine whether the County had an appropriate information security management program and the extent to which the County's Information Technology Services (ITS) organization had implemented the six Basic Controls identified by the Center for Internet Security Controls in CIS Controls, Version 7.1.



Assessment: Based on industry standards and best practices, the Auditor's Office assessed the five recommendations as in progress. County management reported these recommendations as implemented and disagrees with the Auditor's assessment. The Auditor's Office will follow up on the status of the recommendations in a year.
