## hMPXV (Monkeypox) Update

Public Health Division Manager, Dr. Marie Boman-Davis shared with PHAC members how Washington County Public Health is responding to hMPXV.

- Mid-July hMPXV was announced as a World-Wide emergency by WHO
- Recently the federal government announced it as a Public Health Emergency
- Governor Brown conducted listening sessions recently on the outbreaks in Oregon
- Isolation is part of treatment for hMPXV and we are talking with our community and government partners about wrap-around supports (such as bills and food) for those in need
- On 8/11 Disease Control and Prevention Program staff conducted our first vaccine clinic where over 200 doses were available. Additional doses will be available the following two Tuesdays. To find out if you are eligible and be put on the wait list for the vaccine, please call 503-988-8939.
