




Using Data to Prioritize Vaccine Work

- OHA and County race/ethnicity and age data
- Health Share weekly reports and Data Dashboard
- ZIP code and census tract data
- Recommendations from CBO partners

ZIP codes with the most people remaining to be vaccinated for COVID-19 to reach 80% are shown in red.

The darker the red, the more people in the ZIP code who are not vaccinated for COVID-19. Select a ZIP code to highlight the bar chart.





Engagement and Outreach Efforts

- Early on community engagement and outreach grants for CBOs
 - Included funding for "advising the county"
- Listening sessions with CBO partners
 - COVID-19 Racial Equity Advisory Group
 - Latinx
 - Black and African American
 - One on one conversations
- Provided additional funding to organizations to create culturally-specific focused communications and campaigns
- Train the trainer model for CHW Vaccine 101
 - County staff trained
 - Provide training for Culturally Specific CBO CHWs and Promotores

Washington County Vaccine Appointment HelpLine

- Staffed by Public Health Institute
- Initiated in March 2021
- For people who need computer or language assistance
- Staffed Monday-Saturday
- Response usually in 24 hours
- 3,327 appointments made from 6,835 calls
- 40% Spanish-language calls; 10% Vietnamese,
 Mandarin, Cantonese, Korean, Arabic, Portuguese and other languages



Vaccine Clinics Overview

- Vaccine appointment scheduling Helpline
- Early community clinics co-hosted or led by culturally-specific CBO partners
 - Asian Health and Service Center
 - Muslim Educational Trust
 - Centro Cultural
 - Living Islands
- Worked with CBO partners to promote event and schedule appointments
- Mobile and pop-up clinics





Community Clinics

- 40 clinics since February
- 15,000 vaccinations administered
- Partners include
 - Pacific University, Centro Cultural, St.
 Anthony's Church, Village Church, Korean Society of Oregon, Muslim Education Trust, Asian Health and Service Center, City of Tigard, Conectate!, Hillsboro Chamber, Medical Reserve Corps, Nike, Columbia Sportswear, Intel, Tualatin Valley Fire & Rescue and many more





Mobile Clinics

- 411 Doses (88 per day) since early July
- 2 locations per day, including:
 - Farmer's markets, BIPOC owned grocery stores, parks near low-income apartment complexes, local events
- Partners include
 - Adelante Mujeres, Center for African Immigrants and Refugees Organization (CAIRO), Korean Society of Oregon, Chinese Friendship Association, UTOPIA PDX, Centro Cultural, Bienestar, African Family Holistic Health Organization, and many others including Health System Partners
- Mobile Clinic Calendar
 - English
 - Spanish






Vaccine Equity and COVID Resilience & Recovery Funding



Understanding Community Needs

- Listening sessions with partners
- Focus on Social Determinants of Health
- Understand that COVID is not the only priority





- Include a racial equity lens
- Low barrier process
- Blend and braid different funding streams
- Support both vaccine and recovery work

Vaccine	e Related Activities (choose at least one)
	Co-host a clinic (provide more extensive onsite and offsite support with planning, scheduling, interpretation, check-in, second dose scheduling, and clinic flow) Provide onsite support (provide interpreters, staff/volunteers for the day of the event) Vaccine system navigation (schedule appointments for county clinics, help people navigate online vaccine scheduling, help arrange transportation or address other barriers)
	Outreach and education to address vaccine hesitancy or access issues
	Communications campaign or materials
	Advise Washington County Public Health on vaccine distribution efforts
