




COLD CASE INVESTIGATIONS

Can You Help Solve This Cold Case?

Lori Billingsley was a junior at Aloha High School who helped tutor students in the counseling section, but otherwise was quiet in terms of school affairs. She was 17 years old, with light brown shoulder-length hair, brown eyes, and wearing barrettes in her hair. She left her home on Southwest Heritage Court in Aloha with friends at about 9 pm on October 10, 1982.

Lori's body was found 12 hours later in a ditch on Southwest Miller Hill Road. She had been, strangled, stabbed and beaten to death.



If you lived in Washington County at that time, you likely read the newspaper articles below. They describe her clothing, including a distinctive t-shirt, and ran her high school photo. You might remember hearing that witchcraft was involved and a second body was discovered, but those rumors were quickly dispelled.

The case had few leads but investigators continued to work the case. In March 1983, they offered a \$3,000 reward to anyone with information that would lead to the arrest and prosecution of the person responsible for her death. While suspect information was developed, detectives lacked the evidence needed to prosecute the case.
