Hillsboro Man Dies in Early Morning Crash

June 25, 2016—Sheriff's Deputies responded to a crash where a vehicle left the roadway and collided with a tree. The driver did not survive his injuries.

On June 25, 2016, at 1:04 a.m., Washington County Sheriff's Deputies, assisted by Hillsboro Police Department, were called to SW Highway 219 south of Clean Water Services concerning a single vehicle crash.

Sheriff's Deputies arrived and found a 2005 Honda Civic over an embankment on the west side of the road. Sheriff's Deputies determined the Honda was travelling north on SW Highway 219 when it failed to negotiate a curve. The Honda then drove off the west side of the road, struck a tree and rolled over.

Sheriff's Deputies found that Dashiell Solberg-Bell, 22, from Hillsboro, was the driver and sole occupant of the Honda. He was pronounced deceased at the scene.

Preliminarily, Sheriff's Deputies were not able to determine why Mr. Solberg-Bell left the roadway, although excessive speed appears to be a contributing factor. The Washington County Crash Analysis Reconstruction Team and Tualatin Valley Fire & Rescue assisted with the crash.

Highway 219 was closed for about two hours to investigate the crash. Investigators have not determined if there were other factors that contributed to this crash. This case is still under investigation.
