Narcotics Investigation Leads to Arrest of Father, Son in Aloha

February 28, 2019

On February 25, 2019, at 7:40 p.m., Washington County Sheriff's Office deputies conducted a traffic stop at Aloha Market Centre, located in the 20200 block of Tualatin Valley Highway. The stop was part of an ongoing narcotics investigation.

With the assistance of Washington County Sheriff's Office K-9 Taz, investigators located a significant amount of cash and cocaine inside the vehicle. The driver, Luis Madrigal, 21, of Beaverton, was arrested for delivery of cocaine and possession of cocaine.

Investigators responded to Mr. Madrigal's residence, located in the 20000 block of Rock Road in Aloha, to continue their investigation. Luis' father, Ramiro Madrigal-Magana, was located nearby and attempted to flee on foot but was quickly caught.

With assistance from the Westside Interagency Narcotics (WIN) team, investigators seized two rifles, one rifle/grenade launcher combination, two handguns, a shotgun, over \$19,000 in cash, and evidence

of a drug dealing operation. A total of 1.6 pounds of cocaine was seized during the investigation, with an approximate street value of \$25,000.

Mr. Madrigal-Magana, 47, of Beaverton, was charged with delivery of cocaine, possession of cocaine, felon in possession of weapon, interfering with police, and possession of a fictitious ID.

The Westside Interagency Narcotics (WIN) team is a multi-

agency team comprised of members from the Washington County Sheriff's Office, Beaverton Police Department, Hillsboro Police Department, Oregon Air National Guard, Homeland Security Investigations, and Federal Bureau of Investigation.

Washington County is a designated county within the <u>Oregon-Idaho High Intensity Drug Trafficking</u> <u>Area</u> (HIDTA). This program provides federal assistance to the WIN team and all of its participating agencies.
