Additional Recycling Collection Policy Timeline

Board Direction

January 18, 2022 – Work Session

- Staff sought guidance on regulatory approaches for providing additional recycling collection services
- Board directed staff to:
 - Amend Administrative Rules to temporarily allow services to continue to be provided
 - Develop a new additional recycling collection service program to be delivered by certificate holders
- January 25, 2022 Resolution and Order (RO) 22-15
 - Directed staff to develop an expansion of curbside recycling collection services to be offered by certificated haulers



Additional Recycling Collection Service Proposal

Phase 1 (single-family to 4-plex)

- Effective upon adoption
 - Add batteries to standard curbside recycling collection service for all residential customers
- Effective July 1, 2022
 - Optional additional recycling collection service available to all urban residential customers
 - Additional items collected in hauler-provided plastic bags, contained within a separate lidded bin (15 to 25 gallon)
 - Plastic Film
 - #1 PET Clear Plastic Clamshells
 - Textiles
 - Compact Fluorescent Lightbulbs





Additional Recycling Collection Service Proposal

Phase 1 (single-family to 4-plex) – continued

- Additional fee separate from regular monthly collection service
 - \$2.50 monthly base fee and a flat fee of \$9.25 per pick-up (curbside), \$11.70 per pick-up (non-curbside), or \$13.02 per pick-up (distant non-curbside)
- On-call service customer requests pick-up two business days in advance, at no more than every-other-week intervals
- Haulers shall participate in reuse collection drives for additional recycling collection service customers
- County may adjust materials collected in the program in response to changes in recycling processing capacity or availability of recycling markets
- Phase 2 (multifamily) Effective July 1, 2023
 - Service shall be made available to multifamily households
 - May require property manager or HOA approval





Incorporating Community Input

Community engagement takeaways

- Interest in the program is strong (opt-in model), but correlates with cost – the more expensive the service the less interested community members are
 - Incorporating input advocate for program options to limit cost
- #1 PET Plastic Clamshells were tied with plastic film as most desired material category
 - Incorporating input include #1 PET Plastic Clamshells in program proposal
- Reuse is important
 - Incorporating input Include quarterly reuse collection drives as component of the program





Incorporating Community Input

Community engagement takeaways, continued

- Community members wanted less frequent service options, monthly or every-other-month or quarterly
 - Incorporating input develop on-call program with ability to tailor service to needs and minimize overall cost through lower monthly base rate and higher per-pick-up rate
- Serving community members that live in multifamily settings is important
 - Incorporating input Require service be provided to multifamily properties by July 1, 2023
