




National Preparedness Month

- Type: Natural or human-made

- Scope: Disruptive, system interference, or shutdown

Response: In system, regional or statewide, debris management, alternative disposal options










Metro regional disaster planning

2030 Regional Waste Plan

- Goal 17 Effectively coordinate public & private partnerships in planning for the impact of disasters on the solid waste system.
- Goal 18 Ensure routine garbage & recycling collection, processing, transport and disposal operations can be restored quickly following a system disruption.
- Goal 19 Plan disaster debris response operations to expedite the clearance and removal of debris, making the best use of locally- based services and materials and maximizing recovery.


County's disaster debris management

Debris Management Plan

- Purpose:
 - Facilitate & coordinate the management of disastergenerated debris.
 - Expedite recovery efforts and address threats to improved public or private property.

Metro MOU

- Purpose:
 - Identify mutual expectations to collaboratively address disaster debris management in order to prepare for, respond to, and recover from debris generating events.

- Solid Waste & Recycling COOP plan
- Key Objectives:
 - To ensure the continuous performance of essential functions/operations during an emergency.
 - To protect essential facilities, equipment, records, and other assets.
 - To reduce or mitigate disruptions to operations.
 - To reduce loss of life, minimize damage and losses.
 - . To identify and designate principals and support staff to be relocated.
 - To facilitate decision-making for execution of the COOP and the subsequent conduct of operations.
 - To achieve a timely and orderly recovery from the emergency and resumption of full service to all customers.
