
About Us

At home

- Produce and distribute bilingual educational material
- Maintain Garbage and Recycling Day app
- Maintain the regional Eat Smart Waste Less website
- Provide education about Recycle+
- Engage at community events





Multifamily Properties

- On-site assessment for garbage and recycling areas
- Technical assistance to property managers
- Signage in garbage and recycling areas
- Free educational materials and outreach events for community members
- Quarterly e-newsletter (ES-EN) for property manager
- Support with regional service standard implementation





At work

- Provide free waste prevention tools, assistance and education resources
- Assess waste and recycling
- Connect reuse and rescue organizations
- Provide sustainability certification
- Highlight small, diverse businesses
- Work closely with food businesses
- Collaborate with partner organizations





At community events

- Lend collection area signage and equipment for redeemable cans, other recyclables and garbage
- Provide assistance and recommendations to event organizers





Repair

- Plan and coordinate pop-up community repair events at various locations
- Recruit volunteers from the community
- Share repair tips and resources through the Repair Fair e-newsletter and Facebook page
- Webpage with event schedule and links to sign up items for repair





Collection and Cleanup Events

- Collect tires, plastics, electronics, furniture, etc.
- Support partner cities with city-wide cleanup or collection events
- Assist housing development organizations and multifamily communities
- Collaborate with volunteer groups like the Promotores Ambientales and Master Recyclers
